

Chaplain's Report

Brother Knights,

The desert is an image that comes to mind when thinking about the season of Lent. We get this image from our Gospel reading this upcoming



Sunday where Jesus is in the desert preparing himself for his public ministry. Why would Jesus take this time to spend in such a dry, hot, and isolated part of the world? It is because the discipline of fasting helps one hunger for what truly matters and getting away from the busyness of everyday life allows one to listen to God more closely.

Christ's example of spending time in the desert had a huge impact on some of the early desert Fathers such as St. Anthony the Great. This revered desert father wanted to break away from the noise of society to take time to listen to God. His ascetical lifestyle inspired other Christians to live in community and helped pave the way for monastics. While most of us will not be in a literal desert or monastery this year, we can apply the principle of breaking away from the noise and activities that numb us from listening to our Lord.

Lent is not the most comfortable liturgical season but we do get time to be introspective about where we are in the spiritual life. Take these forty days to responsibly detach from the noise and busyness of life and focus on where God is calling us to grow in holiness.

February Business Meeting Highlights

The February business meeting was held on Monday, February 3

- The Grand Knight reminded Brothers of upcoming events:
 - New Degree Ceremonial—tentatively planned for April
 - Fish Fries Friday 2/7 and every Friday in Lent, starting Friday 2/28; workers are needed. A motion was approved to spend up to \$100 in Facebook promotions for the Fish Fries
 - Theology on Tap: Tuesday 2/18 with Fr. James. Subject is "Moral Relativism"
- The Financial Secretary reported 82 members with dues unpaid for 2020. Over \$1000 has been donated by Honorary Life Members.
- The Financial Secretary also reported that a grant from VKCCI was made to a local resident in extreme need.
- The Grand Knight commended BK Val Bernys for an excellent job organizing the Super Bowl Party.
- The Virginia State Convention will be held May 1-3 at the Koger Center in Richmond. It is anticipated that Brian Ripple will be elected as State Deputy. Motions were passed to spend \$100 for a hole sponsorship at the golf tournament and \$500 for the hospitality suite.
- The 4th Degree Color Corps Training has been postponed; Renewal of Obligations ceremony to be held 2/24 in Roanoke.
 Exemplification to be held 4/18 in Virginia Beach.
- A meeting of the Fundraising Committee will be held Thursday, 2/27. Discussion of fundraising options is ongoing.
- The Field Agent described a new approach for promoting membership after Sunday Masses. He also appealed to members to support the golf tournament at the state convention - entry is \$100/player.

- 200th anniversary hats are on sale for \$20, proceeds to support Bishop's Jubilee Fund.
- The District Deputy asked Brother Knights to help promote the new ceremonial; he also asked for support to the Grand Knight for writing program reports.

- The Financial Secretary gave a report on VKCCI under "Good of thee Order".
 Virginia Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc. (VKCCI) provides grants (up to \$4000) to individuals in special need.
 Grant proposals are submitted by local Grand Knights; a board of 13 reviews grant requests. Funds are paid directly to recipient creditors. VKCCI provides about \$130K in grants per year.

A kick off meeting for 40 Days was held on Tuesday Feb 25th at St. Elias Church. A large 4'x8' banner featuring 5 baby pix and a Choose Life legend was installed. There is another banner at St. Gerard, at St. Francis of Assisi, at Westminster Presbyterian Church and at the house purchased by the Better Than Life group which is adjacent to planned Parenthood.

With the wholesale legislative onslaught against Holy Innocents in the womb in our suffering Commonwealth, perhaps a few more folks will consider volunteering to help their parishes make a public and prayerful protest at PP or Second Street. During the last campaign in Roanoke 2 or 3 babies were saved that we have info about. PP keeps stats that when 40 Days is onsite their rate of no-shows for abortions goes way up - so many babies are saved that no one knows about.

Saint of the Month

Patrick, Bishop and Patron Saint of Ireland

Patrick was born in 5th Century Britain; at age 16 he was carried into slavery in Ireland, where he spent six bleak years there as a herdsman. Subsequently he fled his master and found passage to Britain. There he suffered a second brief captivity before he was reunited with his family.

But he was called to return to Ireland. Utterly confident in the Lord, he journeyed far and wide, baptizing and confirming with untiring zeal. By the end of his life, the overwhelming majority of Irishmen had been converted to Christianity.

The legends of Patrick have continued to grow. One of these would have it that he drove the snakes of Ireland into the sea; "snakes" have been seen in a symbolic sense as demons. Another legend, probably the most popular, is that of the shamrock, which has him explain the concept of the Holy Trinity by showing the three-leaved plant with one stalk. Traditionally, Irishmen have worn shamrocks, the national flower of Ireland, in their lapels on St. Patrick's Day, March 17.


New Ceremonial

Knights of Columbus Founders Day March 29



In late-19th century Connecticut, Father Michael J. McGivney, the 29-year-old assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Conn., gathered a group of men at his parish on Oct. 2, 1881. He proposed establishing a lay organization, the goal of which would be to prevent Catholic men from entering secret societies whose membership was antithetical to Church teaching, to unite men of Catholic faith, and to provide for the families of deceased members.

As a symbol that allegiance to their country did not conflict with allegiance to their faith, the organization's members took as their patron Christopher Columbus — recognized as a Catholic and celebrated as the discoverer of America. Thanks to Father McGivney's persistence, the Knights of Columbus elected officers in February 1882 and officially assumed corporate status on March 29, 1882.
