Feast of All Saints

All Saints' Day is dedicated to the Saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven, focusing on those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church. All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV in 609 AD who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and



all the Martyrs. The holy day was established on November 1 by Pope Gregory III in the mid-eighth century. Following the reign of Charlemagne, the holy day became a holy day of obligation by decree of Pope Gregory

Saint of the Month Leo The Great, Pope

Saint Leo the Great, also known as Pope Saint Leo I, was born into a Roman aristocratic family around 400AD. His is regarded as one of the greatest popes of Christian history; in fact, he was the first pope to be given the title "the Great." Details pertaining to Leo's birth are not known, but it is believed his ancestors come from Tuscany.


St. Leo the Great became a very well-known deacon of the Church by 431; he was widely respected for his love for the Lord, intelligence and persuasive nature. He was also gifted in bringing reconciliation between disputing groups of Christians. He was often sent out to settle disputes, both secular and theological.

In 440, Leo was elected as pope to succeed Pope Sixtus III. His swift election reflected the respect he had earned, and the affection the faithful had in him. Pope Leo was deeply dedicated to his service as pope. He saw himself as privileged to sit in the Chair of St Peter. Over time, Leo became known as one of the best administrative popes of the ancient Church.

During his reign, he fought to preserve the unity of the Church and its faith; and to ensure the safety of his people against invasions from foreign enemies. He focused his pontificate on rooting out numerous heresies which were threatening the Western Church.

Along with his dynamic faith and outstanding theological wisdom, Pope Leo I was also a courageous leader. He led Rome's defense against Attila the Hun's barbarian invasion on Italy in 452. Pope St Leo focused heavily on the pastoral care of his people. Pope Leo I was also known for his spiritual sermons, which helped him become one of the greatest popes in the history of the Church. Nearly 100 sermons and 150 letters of Leo I have been preserved.

Leo died on November 10, 461. He was canonized before the Congregation for Saints was formalized. In 1754, Pope Benedict XIV proclaimed Leo I a Doctor of the Church. His feast day is celebrated on November 10.

Beatification of Fr. Michael McGivney

In 1996, the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Hartford opened the cause for canonization, an investigation into McGivney's life with a view towards formal recognition by the Catholic Church of his sainthood. Gabriel O'Donnell is the postulator of Fr. McGivney's cause. He is also the director of the Fr. McGivney Guild, which now has 150,000 members supporting his cause.

The diocesan investigation was closed in 2000, and the case was passed to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints in Vatican City. On March 15, 2008, Pope Benedict XVI approved a decree recognizing McGivney's heroic virtue, thus declaring him as "Venerable.

As of August 6, 2013, a miracle attributed to Fr. McGivney's intercession was under investigation at the Vatican. On May 27, 2020, the miracle attributed to the intercession of Fr. McGivney was approved by Congregation for the Causes of Saints and authorized by Pope Francis.

The beatification Mass for Fr. Michael McGivney is scheduled for October 31, 2020, in Hartford, Connecticut, as announced by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. The mass is scheduled for 11:00 and is being broadcast on EWTN.




Prayer for Canonization of Fr. McGivney

We humbly ask that you glorify Blessed Michael McGivney on earth according to the design of your holy will.

Through his intercession, grant the favor I now present (here make your request). Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
