## Saint of the Month Augustine of Hippo

Augustine was born in 354 in Tagaste, Numidia, a Roman-occupied province in North Africa. His mother, Saint Monica was a devout Christian; his father was a pagan who converted to Christianity on his deathbed. He was a brilliant student and was educated in Numidia, Carthage, and Rome. While in Carthage he developed a deep interest in philosophy. As a young adult, Augustine lived a hedonistic lifestyle for a time, and did not practice Christianity.

He taught grammar and rhetoric in Tagaste, Carthage, Rome, and later in Milan. While in Milan, he was influenced by the teachings and sermons of Ambrose, Bishop of Milan. He converted to Christianity in late 386 and was baptized in 387. In 391 Augustine was ordained a priest in Hippo Regius, Algeria, and in 396, he became Bishop of Hippo, where he remained until his death in 430.

Augustine was a prolific writer and preacher. He is universally recognized as one of the greatest philosophers and theologians of all time. His writings influenced the development of Western philosophy and Western Christianity, and he is viewed as one of the most important of the early Church Fathers. He helped formulate the doctrine of original sin and just war theory. When the Western Roman Empire began to disintegrate, Augustine imagined the Church as a Spiritual City of God. His explanation of the doctrines of God, free will, evil, original sin, grace, illumination, and predestination have become standard for the majority of Christians. Augustine is probably best known for his "Confessions" and "The City of God". and for his defense of Christianity against various heresies of the time.

Augustine of Hippo was canonized by acclamation (before establishment of the Congregation for Causes of Saints). He was named as one of the four original Doctors of the Church by Pope Boniface VIII in 1298. The Roman Catholic religious order, the Order of Saint Augustine, adopted his name and way of life. He is the patron saint of brewers, printers, and theologians. His feast is August 28.

## **Blessed Fr. McGivney**

August is an appropriate time to reflect on the life of our beloved founder, Fr. Michael McGivney. He was born on August 12, 1852 in Waterbury, Connecticut and died on August 14, 1890 in Thomaston, Connecticut. He was ordained a priest on December 22, 1877 at the Baltimore Cathedral of the Assumption. On March 29, 1882, while an assistant pastor at Saint Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut, Fr. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus.

In 1996, the Archdiocese of Hartford opened the cause for canonization with a view towards formal recognition of his sainthood. On March 15, 2008, Pope Benedict XVI declared him as "Venerable". On May 27, 2020, the miracle attributed to the intercession of Fr. McGivney was authorized by Pope Francis, and on October 31, 2020, the beatification Mass of Michael McGivney was celebrated at the Cathedral of Saint Joseph in Hartford, Connecticut.

Fr. Gabriel O'Donnell is the director of the Fr. McGivney Guild, supporting his cause for sainthood. Membership in the Guild is free and open to anyone. Members receive a quarterly newsletter and are remembered in a weekly Mass. Visit:

# Roanoke Council 562 Resolution on Expenditure July 2021

The following resolution was read at the July meeting and will be considered at the August meeting:

**Whereas**, renovations are underway on St. Andrew's church.

And Whereas, a memorial plaque for Rev. John William Lynch, founder and first pastor of St. Andrew's, was dedicated by Roanoke Council 562 on Columbus Day October 12, 1937,

And Whereas, this memorial plaque required restoration work which St. Andrew's parish completed and now has the restored plaque on display on the exterior of the church to the left of the main entrance,

**And Whereas,** St. Andrew's requested assistance from Roanoke Council 562 with the expense of the restoration of this plaque,

And Whereas, Roanoke Council 562 supports local parishes, especially St. Andrew's, which is one of the three parishes the council serves,

And Whereas, the memorial plaque was erected by Roanoke Council in 1937 and the current members have an opportunity to continue supporting local parishes and to participate in the history of St. Andrew's and this council,

**Be It Resolved** that Roanoke Council 562 shall issue a monetary donation to the St. Andrew's parish in the amount of \$600 thus covering half of the \$1200 expense incurred by the parish for the restoration.

**Be It Further Resolved** that Roanoke Council 562 encourage its members to contribute time and treasure to St. Andrew's, Our Lady of Nazareth and St. Elias.
