

Saint of the Month Francis of Assisi

Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone was born into a wealthy Italian family in 1181 or 1182. His father called his son Francesco ("Free man"). In his youth, he lived a lavish life of a wealthy young man.

Around 1202, he joined a military expedition; he was taken prisoner and spent a year as in captivity. An illness caused him to re-evaluate his life, and a strange vision made him lose interest in the worldly life. He spent some time in lonely places, asking God for spiritual enlightenment. He had a mystical vision of Jesus Christ in the chapel of San Damiano, in which the Icon of Christ Crucified said to him, "Francis, Francis, go and repair My house". In the succeeding months, he renounced his materialistic lifestyle and wandered as a beggar. He gathered stones and rebuilt the chapel of San Damiano and the nearby chapel of St. Mary of the Angels.

In 1208, Francis devoted himself completely to a life of poverty and began preaching the Gospel in the surrounding area. His example attracted many others. Within a year Francis had eleven followers, who lived a simple, communal life. In 1209 he composed a simple rule for his followers "to follow the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ and to walk in his footsteps". On April 16, 1210, Pope Innocent III authorized the establishment of the Franciscan Order. In 1212. Francis and Claire of Assisi founded the Second Order of Franciscans ("Poor Clares"); subsequently the Secular Franciscan Order was founded for lay men and women. As the numbers of friars grew at an unprecedented rate, the order was divided into five provinces and reorganized with increased structure.

Francis set out to imitate Christ and literally carry out his work. He and his followers

celebrated and even venerated poverty. He believed that nature itself was the mirror of God. He called all creatures his "brothers" and "sisters", and even preached to the birds. Around 1220, Francis celebrated Christmas by setting up the first crèche (Nativity scene) so that worshipers could contemplate the birth of the child Jesus in a direct way.

Francis is said to have had a vision on or about September 13, 1224, as a result of which he received the stigmata; an angel gave him the gift of the five wounds of Christ." Suffering from these stigmata and from near blindness, Francis received medical care to no avail. He died on October 3, 1226.

On July 16, 1228, Francis was canonized by Pope Gregory IX. The next day, the pope laid the foundation stone for the Basilica of St. Francis in Assisi. Francis' feast day is

observed on October 4. On November 29, 1979, Pope John Paul II declared Francis the patron saint of

40 Days for Life

The fall, 2021 40 Days for Life campaign is being celebrated from September 22 to October 31, 2021. During these days, we focus on ending the tragedy of abortion.

Christ told us some demons can only be driven out by prayer and fasting. The two go hand in hand. Prayer keeps us rooted in the fact that it is our desire to carry out God's will. Fasting is a sacrifice that helps us reach beyond our own limitations with God's help. The visible, public centerpiece of 40 Days for Life is a focused, 40-day, non-stop, round-the-clock prayer vigil outside the Planned Parenthood center on Peters' Creek Rd. It is a peaceful and educational presence. Those who are called to stand witness during this 24-hour-a-day presence send a powerful message to the community about the tragic reality of abortion.

BK Dan Derringer Ordained as Deacon

We are very pleased and proud to announce that Brother Knight, Dan Derringer was ordained to the permanent deaconate on Saturday, September 25 at the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in Richmond.. Bishop Barry C. Knestout ordained 15 men to the permanent diaconate, instructing them to "be stewards of God's mysteries."

In Acts 6:1-7b, the apostles call forth the deacons; Bishop Knestout said, "The apostles want and need to devote themselves to prayer and word; sacrifice is their priority, yet they also must ensure that the good works of the Church are properly expressed and not neglected." Inspired by the love of God, Bishop Knestout said, deacons' works of charity express and return that love, which leads to deeper prayer and a greater receptivity to hearing God's Word in order to build up the Church community.

Dan is a long time member of St Andrew's parish and a Professor of Chemistry at Hollins University. He joined the Roanoke Knights of Columbus in 2017. Our heartfelt congratulations are extended to Deacon Dan, his family, and the St. Andrew's community on the occasion of his ordination.
