Saint of the Month

John Neumann

John Neumann was born in Prachatice in Bohemia (now the Czech Republic) on March 28, 1811. He studied theology in the seminary of Budweis. He was looking forward to being ordained in 1835 when the bishop decided there would be no more ordinations - most of Europe was overstaffed with priests at that time. Finally, he communicated with bishops in America. Neumann was ordained a priest by the bishop of New York in June 1836.

In January 1842 he entered the Redemptorists. A tireless missionary, he ministered to European immigrants in Baltimore, then in Pittsburgh. In 1852, at the age of 41, he was named bishop of Philadelphia.

Neumann had a strong effect on the religious life of the United States by founding Catholic schools and promoting devotion to the Eucharist. In just seven years, he built 89 churches, as well as several hospitals and orphanages. As a bishop in Philadelphia, Neumann founded the first Catholic diocesan school system in the US. Under his administration, the number of parochial schools in his diocese increased from one to 200

On January 5, 1860, at the age of 48, he died suddenly of a heart attack. Neumann was beatified during the Second Vatican Council on October 13, 1963, and was canonized on June 19, 1977 by Pope Paul VI.

St. John Neumann is invoked as a patron of sick children and of immigrants.

Feast of Epiphany

The Feast of Epiphany is one of the oldest feast days in Christian tradition, following Easter and Christmas. It commemorates the visit of the Magi to the infant Jesus. Christian theological tradition has always stressed that Gentiles as well as Jews came to worship Jesus. Thus Epiphany commemorates Christ's physical manifestation to the Gentiles. Western Christian tradition sets the number number of Magi at three, probably based on the three gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh" presented to the infant Jesus Matthew, Chapter 2). (In the Eastern Christian tradition, the number of Magi is set at twelve.)

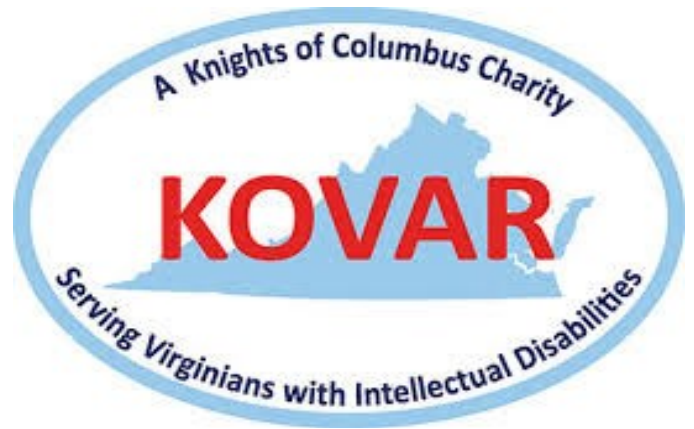
Subsequent traditions embellished the narrative. As early as the 3rd century they were considered to be kings, maybe due to Psalm 72:11, "May all kings fall down before him" In about the 8th century the names of three Magi appear: they have become known most commonly as Balthasar, king of Arabia, Melchior, king of Persia, and Caspar, king of India.

2022 Canfield Scholarships

The Scholarship Committee of Knights Council # 562 recently announced the 2022 call for applications for Sir Knight Albert H. Canfield Scholarships. Up to ten scholarships (\$500.00 each) are allowed for deserving students from the greater Roanoke area parishes served by Knights of Columbus Council #562. As recently reported, we presented a number of awards last Spring.

In the past, students have attended training schools and colleges across Virginia and in other states. Areas of study ranged from law to pre-med, engineering, and more.

Next step: applications for 2022 will be due on April 1, 2022. Check the council website (www.kofc562.net) for application forms and related information. More scholarships are also available through the Knights of Columbus Virginia State Council and Supreme Council. Contact those offices directly for application information. Those deadlines are as early as February and March.

The Canfield Scholarship Committee has been meeting regularly and is proposing amendments and new procedures for this year's awards.



Proposed Changes to Canfield Scholarship Resolution

The scholarship committee is proposing changes to the Sir Knight Albert H. Canfield Memorial Council College Scholarship and Loan Fund Resolution. The entire resolution is presented below; proposed changes (additions) are in bold all capitals, deletions are shown in italics.

Sir Knight Albert H. Canfield Memorial Council College Scholarship and Loan Fund

Whereas, in 1989 Roanoke Council, No. 562 initiated the *“Keep Christ in Christmas – Send Religious Christmas Cards”* campaign in Roanoke, and throughout the State of Virginia; and

Whereas, through this special program \$1,000 was raised at that time and used to establish a perpetual local Council #562 scholarship fund, which was later named the Sir Knight Albert H. Canfield Memorial CCS & LF on March 6, 1992; and

Whereas, over the years additional monies generated by the *“Keep Christ in Christmas – Send Religious Christmas Cards”* statewide campaign have added to our educational scholarship fund, sustained and ensured by the interest generated from this fund, along with other amounts as voted by the membership; and

Whereas, a five-member Scholarship Committee, to coordinate the application and review process for awarding scholarships, was established: comprised of four members, one being a PGK, with staggered four-year terms and

the current Grand Knight, having the new member elected at the time of the annual Council election process, and the Scholarship Committee Chairman appointed by the current Grand Knight; and

Whereas, applicants for these scholarships are eligible for consideration if their father **OR GRANDFATHER** is a member in good standing of Council #562, or was at the time of his death; and

Whereas, eligible applicants for these funds are students seeking to further their education at *[college]* **POST-SECONDARY** study levels, and **EACH RECIPIENT IS LIMITED TO NO MORE THAN FOUR AWARDS**; and

Whereas, a maximum of ten scholarship awards *[of five-hundred dollars each]* be awarded annually, with two of those scholarship awards dedicated for current members in good standing of Council #562 and that meet scholarship application criteria, **WITH A MAXIMUM OF TWELVE HUNDRED DOLLARS PER AWARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ANNUAL BUDGETED AMOUNT.**

Be it further resolved that, any monies received in excess of the Sir Knight Albert H. Canfield Memorial College Scholarship needs for that year be designated to the scholarship fund account, and should any monies needed by the Sir Knight Albert H. Canfield Scholarship, due to an insufficient amount being received from the State Knights of Columbus of Virginia program, be obtained from the scholarship fund account; and

Be it further resolved that, all prior motions and resolutions concerning the Sir Knight Albert H. Canfield CCS & LF be hereby superseded by this resolution.
