40 Days for Life

The Fall 2022 40 Days for Life campaign will be held from September 28 to November 6. The purpose is to end the injustice of abortion. Each day during 40 Days for Life, individuals, churches, families, and groups will be asked to join together in prayer and fasting for a specific request so the entire Body of Christ can unite around a common focus.

The visible, public centerpiece of 40 Days for Life is a focused, 40-day, non-stop, round-the -clock prayer vigil outside the Planned Parenthood center on Peters Creek Rd. Those who are called to stand witness during this 24 -hour-a-day presence send a powerful message to the community about the tragic reality of abortion. It also serves as a call to repentance for those who work at the abortion center and those who patronize the facility.

Saint of the Month John XXIII - Pope

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was born in the small village of Sotto il Monte in Italy, on November 25, 1881. He was the third of fourteen children born to poor sharecropper parents. He attended elementary school in the town, was tutored by a local priest, and at the age of twelve entered the seminary at Bergamo. He was ordained in 1904 at the age of 23.

In 1905, Angelo was appointed secretary to the new Bishop of Bergamo. From 1921-1935, Angelo Roncalli served in several roles in the Vatican Diplomatic Service. In 1935, he was appointed Apostolic Delegate to Bulgaria, Turkey and Greece. He used his office to help the Jewish underground in saving thousands of refugees in Europe during World War II. On December 22, 1944, Pope Pius XII named him to be the Apostolic Nuncio to France. After 1944, he played an active role in gaining Catholic Church support for the establishment of the modern State of Israel. On January 12, 1953, he was appointed Patriarch of Venice and raised to the rank of Cardinal by Pope Pius XII.

Following the death of Pope Pius XII in 1958, Angelo Roncalli was elected to succeed as Pope John XXIII. Soon after his coronation, he announced that he was summoning an ecumenical council - a general meeting of the bishops of the church. His purpose was to "bring the church up to date" and to work for its spiritual regeneration.

Pope John XXIII is mostly remembered for convening The Second Vatican Council ("Vatican II"). The council was held in four sessions at St. Peter's Basilica between 1962 and 1965. Modern cultural changes prompted a need to reconsider church practices. A total of 16 documents came out of it, laying a foundation for the church as we know it today. A theme of the documents was reconciliation. They allowed for Catholics to pray with other Christian denominations, encouraged friendship with other non-Christian faiths, and opened the door for languages besides Latin to be used during Mass. Other new positions concerned education, the media and divine revelation.

Pope John XXIII died on June 3, 1963 (before the completion of Vatican II). He was Beatified by Pope John Paul II on September 3, 2000 and Canonized on April 27, 2014 by Pope Francis. His Feast Day is October 11, the anniversary of the opening of Vatican II.

Applications Open for 2023 Canfield Scholarships

The Scholarship Committee of Knights Council 562 recently announced the 2022 Sir Knight Albert H. Canfield Scholarship process is now open. Several \$1000 scholarships are allowed for deserving students from the greater Roanoke area parishes served by Knights of Columbus Council 562. As recently reported, we presented a number of awards last spring.

In the past, students have attended training schools and colleges across Virginia and in other states, as well. Areas of study ranged from law to pre-med, to engineering, and more.

These deadlines are as early as **February and March**.

3. PAPER TICKET SALES: Paper Ticket holders must PRINT LEGIBLY their name, address, and telephone number on the stub. Save time--Address labels can be used. Put your name on the KC Member Name section of the stub and include your Council-Number OR Assembly Number. You keep the stub and give the Membership Card with attached Football Frenzy ticket to the supporter.

PAPER STUB RETURN: Turn in all stubs with the collected money (\$10.00 per stub).

Councils must return by: FRIDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2022.

4. TEAMS: Football Frenzy tickets have 4 teams each week and the 4 teams change weekly. No two tickets have the same 4 teams on any given week. Team codes are listed on the back of the ticket.

 DATES: Football Frenzy tickets are valid for the last 10 weeks of the Pro football season. Week #1 is November 6th. Week #2 is November 13th, Week #3 is November 20th, etc.

6. PRIZES: TOTAL PRIZES will be \$10,000! Prizes are awarded weekly to the ticket holders with the 4 teams that score the most or the least number of points. These 4-team totals are called the "Highest 4-Team Totals" and the "Lowest 4-Team Totals." The prizes for these winners are listed on the tickets. A total of \$1,000 will be paid to the ticket holders with the "Highest" and the "Lowest" 4-Team totals each week. In case of ties, prizes are combined and split.


