

Saint of the Month Peter Damian

Peter was the youngest child born into a large family in Ravenna, Italy in 1007. His parents died when he was young, so he went to live with one of his older brothers who mistreated him. But another brother, Father Damian, took him in and provided him with an excellent education. Peter was so grateful to his priest brother that he added his brother's name to his own.

Peter was an excellent student. Upon the completion of his education, Peter Damian began a very successful teaching career. But he soon engaged with Benedictine monks and entered a monastery in Fonte-Avellana, where he found a call to monastic life.

As a monk, Peter Damian lived a life of prayer and extreme penance. Eventually he was asked to teach his fellow monks and monks in neighboring monasteries; he also began to write. In 1043, at the young age of 35, Brother Peter Damian was named the prior of his monastery. He soon founded five new hermitages in the surrounding villages.

In 1045, Peter Damian wrote to newly-elected Pope Gregory VI, encouraging him to tackle corruption and scandal within the Church. In the years that followed, more than one pope called on Brother Peter Damian to help accomplish that very goal. He wrote many letters in an attempt to bring about numerous reforms of the clergy.

In 1057, Brother Damian was made the Cardinal-Bishop of Ostia by the pope. As a new cardinal, he quickly challenged his brother cardinals and tried to weed out corruption. Pope after pope called on him for help, even while other church leaders opposed him. In 1072, at the age of 65, Cardinal Peter Damian fell ill and died a week later.

Never formally canonized, St. Peter Damian was celebrated as a saint soon after his death in many of the places associated with his life.

In 1823, Pope Leo XII named him a Doctor of the Church and extended the observance of his feast day throughout the Western Church. Pope Benedict XVI, in his September 9, 2009 general audience, noted that the Benedictine monk, cardinal, and Doctor of the Church, St. Peter Damian (1007-72), was "one of the most significant figures of the 11th century ...

Scholarships Available To Knights and their Families in Virginia

<u>COUNCIL</u> (Scholarships provided by our Knights of Columbus Council here in Roanoke)

Our own Roanoke 562 Council has the Albert H. Canfield Scholarship. An applicant, to be considered, must be a member of Council 562, the wife of a member, or the legally recognized child, or grandchild, of a member provided that the member is in good standing, or if deceased, was in good standing at the time of death. Applications will be considered based on past academic performance, financial need, and a demonstrated dedication to service in the community and/or church. All applications must be received by April 1st and must be accompanied by a copy of the applicant's most recent transcript (transcript does not have to be an official copy). Applications received after the cut-off date or applications received incomplete will not be considered. Applications can be found on the Council's website at: http:// www.kofc562.org/canfield/ and are due by April 1.

<u>STATE</u> (Scholarships through the Knights of Columbus Virginia State Council)

The Virginia Council of the Knights of Columbus has a scholarship called the Father Bader Scholarship. The program offers needbased scholarships for Knights and also their wives and widows of Knights. This award has been extended to include grandchildren of Knights. It also offers scholarship aid to graduating high school seniors who are children of Virginia Knights in good standing. Information can be found at https://wakofc.org/programs/fr-bader-scholarship/

SUPREME (Scholarships through the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council)

There are numerous college scholarships that Supreme either funds or operates in trust. GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF OUTSTANDING YOUNG MAN / WOMAN OF THE YEAR NOMINATION

PURPOSE: To recognize the excellence of the young men and women of our communities and to promote the recognition of their contribution within their community and the Jurisdiction of Virginia.

ELIGIBILITY: Any young man or woman between the ages of **12** & **18** on the <u>due date</u> and residing within the general community jurisdiction of the nominating Council will be considered for the award. Councils <u>must</u> submit both young man and young woman nominations to be considered for the State Deputy Award.

DUE DATE: All nominations are to be turned in to the STATE GENERAL PROGRAM DIRECTOR by <u>March 15, 2023.</u> <u>programsdirector@vakofc.org</u>, and Youth Chairman <u>tobyhrobil-lard@gmail.com</u>

NOMINATION SOURCES: Suggested sources are via solicitation of nominees from:

Council membership

Priests, Ministers, Rabbis and other Religious

Public and/or private schools and their support organizations

Your entire community

SELECTION AT COUNCIL: The methods that local Councils utilize to select their Outstanding Young Man/Woman of the Year (their State Nominee) is at the discretion of each participating council. Factors to consider include:

Outstanding contribution(s) made by the nominee.

Academic excellence

Involvement in civic, religious and/or school-related programs

Participation in extracurricular activities

Special achievements - Any awards/recognition received

Participation with his/her family in performing any of the above

HELPFUL HINTS: The following steps are provided to assist you in preparing and submitting your Council's nominations for competition at the state level.

Begin by making a list of your nominee's contributions, accomplishments, involvement, participation, awards/recognition, achievements, and categorize those lists by item number and name. Include everything that you can under each item. Simply state the individual's academic achievement.

When satisfied that you have listed and categorized all of your nominee's contributions, make a draft of each entry and make it as <u>readable</u> as possible by

Listing the contributions under each item or subtopic.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF OUTSTANDING YOUNG MAN / WOMAN OF THE YEAR NOMINATION (Continued)

Presenting the contributions under each item, using the space provided, use short, concise statements. Shorter <u>is</u> better in this instance. Long-winded, complex and/or rambling sentences tend to confuse the reader (scorer). The reader will score the entry on substance, not writing skill.

When referring to the nominee use terms such as, "our nominee", "this nominee", "our council". Use your imagination to come up with "generic" phrases.

Please use Young Man/Young Woman form, from the Virginia State Website

WHAT NOT TO DO:

Do **not** refer to the nominee by name.

Do **not** refer to your Council name or number.

Do **not** use the nominee's parents, school, city, town or county name.


Do not use the nominee's pastor, church, congregation or any name that would identify or indicate who the nominee is or where they live.

Do <u>not</u> use your own format. Use the forms supplied in this booklet and only the space provided on the forms. If you use another format or forms your submission may be disqualified.

Once you have made a statement or listed an accomplishment about the nominee, **do not** repeat the same information in another category.
