

GK Report, Continued from P1

- Go to Mass Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation (This is approx. 65hrs/yr).
- Go to Confession at least once a year.
- Take Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season.
- Observe prescribed days of abstinence from meat (Fridays of Lent and Ash Wednesday) and follow the days of fasting (Only 2 days of fasting – Ash Wednesday and Good Friday). Fasting is 1 regular size meal and 2 small meals which is not equal to a regular size together.
- Provide for material needs of the Church according to your abilities.

That is the minimum requirements the Church is asking of us to be a practicing Catholic. If you have a relative or friend who has fallen to just a nominal Catholic challenge them to pick up all three points or at least one or two of them. This is what it is to live our Faith.

Saint of the Month Bede the Venerable

Bede was born 672/673 in Northumbria, England; nothing is known of his parentage or early childhood. At the age of seven he was taken to the Benedictine monastery of St. Peter at Monkwearmouth, and later to the monastery of St. Paul at Jarrow. Bede was ordained a deacon when 19 years old and priest when 30. With exception of a few outside visits, he seems to have lived his entire life at Monkwearmouth-Jarrow.


Bede is remembered as a teacher, scholar and prolific writer. He is considered to be one of the greatest teachers and writers of the Early Middle Ages (600-800AD). From the time of his ordination to the priesthood Bede was occupied with learning, writing, and teaching. His most famous work, *Ecclesiastical History of the English People*, gained him the title "The Father of English History." It is an account of Christianity in England up to 729 and is a primary source of early English history.

He is also well-known for his writings on chronology, particularly for calculating the date(s) of Easter. The method of dating events from the time of Christ's birth - i.e., AD (anno Domini) - came into general use through Bede's works on chronology.

Bede is one of the few saints honored as such even during his lifetime; he was as well known and especially recognized for his biblical commentaries and for his other theological works. His writings were filled with such faith and learning that even while he was still alive, a Church council ordered them to be read

publicly in the churches.

Bede died in 735 praying his favorite prayer: "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As is in the beginning, so now, and forever." He was canonized and declared Doctor of the Church in 1899 by Pope Leo XIII. His feast day is May 25.

Resolution to Increase the State Per Capita and Per Diem

Editor's note: The following proposed resolution will be considered at the Virginia State Convention in May, and it will be discussed at the May 1 council meeting to provide input for our delegates to the state convention.

Submitted By: State Officers, Finance Committee, Audit Committee and Past State Deputy Committee

WHEREAS; the Virginia State Council operating income is the per capita assessment; and

WHEREAS; the institution by Supreme Council of the affiliate council program has provided financial relief to the councils it has reduced the Virginia State Council income by approximately 15%; and

WHEREAS; the current per capita of \$4.00 per member is the lowest within the Order in the United States and has not increased since 2003, while operating costs have increased significantly since 2003; and

WHEREAS; the Virginia State Council has not raised the per diem rate of \$50.00 per day and \$0.26 per mile one way for delegates to the Annual Meeting since 2007, while hotel and fuel costs have risen significantly in that time frame and

WHEREAS, other Virginia State Council fundraisers such as football sweepstakes and car raffle have produced very little additional income in recent years; and

WHEREAS, the District Deputies are expected to attend the fall and spring quarterly meetings and are not currently reimbursed for mileage and expenses by the Supreme Council or State Council

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Article V, Section 2 of the Virginia State By-laws be amended to read as follows:

Amount of Assessment: The Annual Per Capita assessment upon Subordinate Councils shall be seven dollars

(\$7.00) per member per year effective with the assessments levied for, and payable beginning with the 2024-2025 Columbian year. In the case of College Councils, the assessment will be fifty percent (50%) of other Subordinate Councils; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Article V, Section 9 be amended to read as follows:

Mileage and Per Diem for Annual Meetings: The minimum per diem and mileage reimbursement rates shall be established beginning with the 2025 Annual Meeting as one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per day and fifty-two cents (\$0.52) per mile one way respectively as recommended by the mileage and per diem committee and approved by the State Council. Only one mileage and per diem payment shall be made to any one individual and a mileage and per diem payment may not be split among more than one individual.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Article V, Section 13 will include the following paragraph:

"The Virginia State Council will shall pay District Deputies who attend the October and March Quarterly meetings, \$0.52 per mile one way and a stipend of \$100.00 if a hotel room night is booked beginning with the 2024-2025 Columbian year.
