Saint of the Month Jerome

Jerome was born around 342 AD in Stridon, Dalmatia (in modern Croatia or Slovenia). Little is known of his early childhood other than his parents were probably well-to-do Christians. He was an excellent student and was well-educated. Around the age of 12, Jerome traveled to Rome to study.

By his own admission, he quickly forgot his morals. While he was not studying, Jerome pursued pleasure, especially with women. Fortunately, Jerome found a Christian influence among his companions, and he changed his ways for the better. Around 366, Jerome was baptized by Pope Liberius. Soon he pursued ecclesiastical training, and in 370 settled in a monastery at Aquileia. The monastery had attracted some of the greatest minds in Christendom. During this time, Jerome developed skills as a translator.

Jerome subsequently travelled to Gaul where he began his writings and then to Antioch, where he lived as a hermit for four years. He was ordained, with the stipulation that he was allowed to pursue his monastic life. He travelled to Constantinople and then to Rome, where he became secretary to Pope Damasus.

Jerome was a brilliant man with considerable sarcasm. He made several enemies, who attacked him with rumors after the death of Pope Damasus in 384. Among the rumors were accusations that he was behaving inappropriately with a woman known as Paula, who became a lifelong friend and follower and later a Saint. Jerome and a group of followers travelled east finally settling in Bethlehem, where they built a monastery. Jerome wrote extensively and spent a large portion of his life translating scriptures from Greek and Hebrew into Latin; he is especially remembered for having made a translation of the Bible into Latin which came to be called the Vulgate.

Jerome died on September 30, 420. He was canonized pre-congregation; his life was so impactful that he was among a group of four men who were declared original Doctors of the Church by Pope Boniface VIII in the 13th century. Jerome is the patron saint of librarians and translators. His Feast Day is September 30.

3. PAPER TICKET SALES: Paper Ticket holders must PRINT LEGIBLY their name, address, and telephone number on the stub. Save time--Address labels can be used. Put your name on the KC Member Name section of the stub and include your Council Number OR Assembly Number. You keep the stub and give the Membership Card with attached Football Frenzy ticket to the supporter.

PAPER STUB RETURN: Turn in all stubs with the collected money (\$10.00 per stub).

Councils must return by: SATURDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2023.

 TEAMS: Football Frenzy tickets have 4 teams each week and the 4 teams change weekly. No two tickets have the same 4 teams on any given week. Team codes are listed on the back of the ticket.

5. DATES: Football Frenzy tickets are valid for the last 10 weeks of the Pro football season. Week #1 is November 5th. Week #2 is November 12th, Week #3 is November 19th, etc. For the purpose of this fundraiser weeks are represented as Sunday dates. Weeks start on the Wednesday before and end the Monday night after each date.

6. PRIZES: TOTAL PRIZES will be \$10,000! Prizes are awarded weekly to the ticket holders with the 4 teams that score the most or the least number of points.
