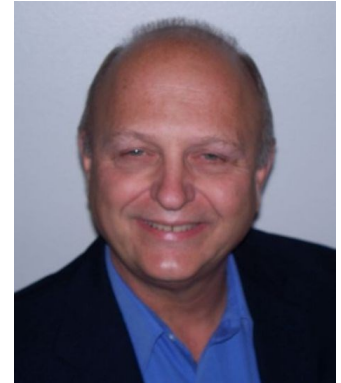
Please note that since Monday, January 2 is an official holiday, our January business meeting will be held **Tuesday, January 3**. Please plan to attend the first meeting of the New Year.

## Keep Christ in Christmas

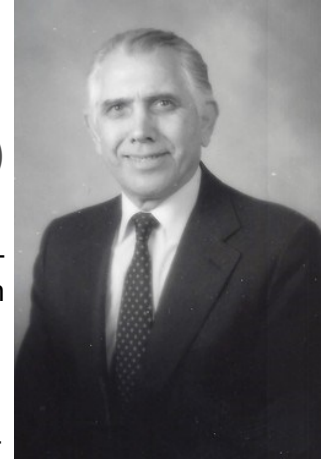

## In Memoriam

### Peter Ragone (1922-2016)



Peter Joseph Ragone of Roanoke, Va., died peacefully at home, in his bed, in the early morning of Tuesday, November 29, 2016.

He entered this world on October 5, 1922, in Brooklyn, N.Y., the first of four children born to Italian immigrants, Michele and Anna Antonia Ragone. While serving in the United States Marine Corps during World War II, he met the love of his life, Drucilla Romine.

In 1978, Peter started Glad Rags, Inc. in Buchanan, Va. The dedicated, hard-working women and men who spent so many years at Glad Rags would attest to Peter's being the heart and soul of Glad Rags.

Peter was a devoted member of Our Lady of Nazareth Catholic Church and a supporter of Roanoke Catholic Schools. He was a past Faithful Navigator of the Knights of Columbus and cherished his fellow knights and the many causes and charities which they supported. His generosity and kindness of heart will not be forgotten by those who knew him or were touched by his generosity. In fact, he enjoyed the camaraderie and fellowship of his brother knights at the council meeting house just the night before he died.

The family received friends during a visitation and viewing on Friday, December 2, 2016, at Oakey's South Chapel. A Funeral Mass was celebrated on Saturday, December 3, 2016, at Our Lady of Nazareth Catholic Church.

Pete will be greatly missed by brother knights and parishioners at OLN. May he rest in peace.
