Saint of the Month Francis de Sales

Francis de Sales was born in 1567 in France into a noble family. He was educated early close to home, then at a Jesuit-run college in Paris. After obtaining his baccalaureate degree in 1584, Francis continued to study theology in Paris as he grew in his own practice of the Faith. He earned two more masters' degrees, followed by a doctorate in law in Padua, Italy, in 1591. He was ordained a priest in 1593.

As Francis was receiving his education, the doctrine of Calvinism was taking root throughout Europe, causing many Catholics to break away from the Faith. Francis was elected provost of the Diocese of Geneva, then a center for the Calvinists. Francis set out to convert them by preaching and distributing little pamphlets he wrote to explain true Catholic doctrine. He was installed as Bishop of Geneva in 1602. While administering his diocese he continued to preach, hear confessions, and catechize the children. His gentle character was a great asset in winning souls.

Francis was a prolific writer. In addition to his two well-known books, the *Introduction to the Devout Life* and *A Treatise on the Love of God.* In addition to his spiritual works, his writings include controversies against Calvinists, letters, sermons, and documents on diocesan administration. He is known for gentle spirit; many of his writings are addressed to lay people. He wants to make them understand that they too are called to be saints. For this, he has been called the "Gentleman Saint."

In December, 1622 Bishop de Sales suffered a stroke and died on December 28. De Sales was beatified in 1661 by Pope Alexander VII, who then canonized him in 1665. De Sales was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius IX in 1877.
