Bring some food to share; we will also hold a chili cook-off as in the past. Come enjoy some great fun, fellowship, good food, and great football!






Saint of the Month Polycarp of Smyrna

Polycarp was likely born in Turkey, about 69 C.E. Little is known of Polycarp's early life; what we do know is from writings of early church Bishops Irenaeus and Tertullian and of St. Jerome. St. Jerome writes that Polycarp was a disciple of John the Apostle and that John had ordained him as a bishop of Smyrna, Greece (modern day Turkey). Polycarp was a companion Irenaeus and of Papias, another "hearer of John", and a correspondent of Ignatius of Antioch. Ignatius addressed a letter to him and mentions him in his letters. Polycarp communicated with several individuals who had seen Jesus during his earthly ministry; therefore he is considered a historical link between the Apostles who knew Jesus and the early church leaders.

Polycarp's most notable writing is his Epistle to the Philippians, in which he refutes various forms of Gnosticism. More importantly is the way in which Polycarp referred to St. Paul the Apostle. He repeatedly quotes from Paul's writings and also stresses the personal importance of Paul as a primary authority of the Christian church. Polycarp's Letter to the Philippians is also important for its early testimony to the existence of various other texts later compiled into the New Testament. It probably is the first to quote passages from the Gospels of Matthew and Luke, the Acts of the Apostles, and the first letters of St. Peter and St. John.

Polycarp was arrested at age 86 and sentenced to death for being a Christian. He was urged to recant his faith but he refused, stating: "Eighty-six years I have served Christ, and He never did me any wrong. How can I blaspheme my King who saved me?" He was burned at the stake, but the fire did not consume his body. When the guards realized that Polycarp could not be burned, they stabbed him with a spear—and the blood that ran down extinguished the flames.

Polycarp is regarded as one of three chief Apostolic Fathers (early Church theologians who personally knew some of the original 12 Apostles), along with Clement of Rome and Ignatius of Antioch. He was canonized pre-congregation; his feast day is February 23.

Field Agent's Report Is a 55-Plus Community Right for You?

Age 55-plus communities are typically a mix of apartments, townhouses, condos and small homes designed with the wants and needs of older adults in mind. Some include perks such as laundry and housekeeping services, or onsite amenities such as spas, fitness centers, salons, and more. As people age, the option of moving to an age-restricted community may be worth looking into. Here are a few considerations:

What could be considered pros? Designed for the 55-plus phase of

life. These homes are targeted to a retiree lifestyle. For example, the location is typically near mass transit and medical centers, and each dwelling is customarily designed to promote accessibility, with features such as walk -in showers, wider doorways and halls, easier access to storage, and elevator access to all floor levels.

Attractive amenities. Imagine having an onsite pool, golf course, and clubhouse with planned activities geared toward residents being able to socialize.

"Not-my-responsibility" up-

keep. Maintenance of the grounds and buildings is usually the responsibility of the community board, giving you time to enjoy whatever you'd like!

What else might you need to consider?

Some residences are quite small. Family visits can make a small living space feel cramped. For those who are less mobile or prefer staying indoors during colder weather, small quarters may feel restrictive for extended periods spent inside.

No young people. Some people age 55 and older find they miss the energy and vitality

provided by neighbors with children, teenagers, and engaging social lives.

The HOA, or Home Owners Association. Some HOAs restrict the types of plants or yard décor you display, the color you can paint your home, or whether and how you can store bicycles or outdoor grills. You might want to read community rules and regulations carefully for restrictions that might affect you. If you are interested in a 55-plus community but are unsure it is the right fit, you might consider a six-month rental in the community to get a better feel.

Scholarships for Knights and Their Families in Virginia

COUNCIL (Scholarships provided by Roanoke Council 562) Our own Roanoke Council 562 has the Albert H. Canfield Scholarship. An applicant, to be considered, must be a member of Council 562, the wife of a member, or the legally recognized child or grandchild of a member provided that the member is in good standing, or if deceased, was in good standing at the time of death. Applications will be considered based on past academic performance, financial need, and a demonstrated dedication to service in the community and/or church. All applications must be received by April 1st and must be accompanied by a copy of the applicant's most recent transcript (transcript does not have to be an official copy). <u>STATE</u> (Scholarships through the Virginia State Council) The Virginia Council of the Knights of Columbus has a scholarship called the Father Bader Scholarship. The program offers need-based scholarships for Knights and also their wives and widows of Knights. This award has been extended to include grandchildren of Knights. It also offers scholarship aid to graduating high school seniors who are children of Virginia Knights in good standing.
