


Saint of the Month James the Great

James was the son of Zebedee and Salome and a cousin of Jesus (Salome was a sister of the Blessed Mother Mary). The title "the Greater" was added to St. James' name to help distinguish him from the Apostle James "the Less," who is believed to have been shorter (not because James the Greater was more important). The Synoptic Gospels state that James and John were fishing with their father by the seashore when Jesus called them to follow him. When the fishermen followed Jesus' instructions, they found their nets full, and after emptying the fish on board, the boats nearly sank from their weight.

James, along with his brother John, and Peter, formed an "inner circle" among the Twelve Apostles. Later, James was one of only three called by Jesus to witness his Transfiguration. Following Christ's Ascension, James spread the Gospel across Israel and the Roman kingdom as well. He traveled and spread the Word for nearly forty years in Spain. It is said that one day, as he prayed, The Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to him and asked him to build her a church, which he did.

According to tradition, James was the first of the twelve Apostles to be martyred. The Acts of the Apostles records that "Herod the king" had James executed by the sword. This may have been caused by James's fiery temper, in which he and his brother earned the nicknames "Sons of Thunder". According to Spanish tradition, following his death his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela, where his shrine attracts Christian pilgrims from all over the world.

James the Great was canonized precongregation; his Feast day is July 25.
