# Saint of the Month Ignatius of Antioch

Little is known of the early life of Ignatius Theophorus. Most of what is known comes from his writings. He was born around 50 AD in Syria and converted to Christianity at a young age. One tradition arose that he was one of the children whom Jesus took in his arms and blessed, as described in Mark 9:35.

As a young man, Ignatius was a loyal disciple of the Apostle John. Around 69 AD, Ignatius was consecrated as the third Bishop of Antioch by St. Peter. Together with Clement of Rome and Polycarp of Smyrna, he is considered one of the three most important Apostolic Fathers – church fathers who are believed to have known some of the original twelve Apostles. He was deeply loved by the Christian faithful, and always made it his special care to defend "orthodoxy" (right teaching) and "orthopraxy" (right practice) among the early Christians.

In 107, during the reign of the Emperor Trajan, Ignatius was sentenced to death because he refused to renounce the Christian faith. He was taken under guard to Rome where he was to be brutally devoured by wild beasts in a public spectacle. During his journey, his travels took him through Asia Minor and Greece. He made good use of the time by writing seven letters of encouragement, instruction, and inspiration to the Christians in those communities.

In his letters, Ignatius outlined many aspects of the faith of the early church: the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, the divinity of Christ, the hierarchical structure of the church, and the understanding of Mary as the Mother of God. We still have these letters as a great treasure of the Church today. He was the first to use the term "Catholic" to refer to the

universal nature of the Church.

Bishop Ignatius was not afraid of death. He followed the Lord Jesus into his Passion, knowing that he would rise with Him in his Resurrection. He longed for martyrdom, believing that this would complete his true discipleship.

His holy martyrdom occurred in the year 107 in the Roman Coliseum. Ignatius Theophorus was canonized Pre-congregation by John the Apostle. His feast day is October 17.
