Month of Remembrance

The month of November is traditionally a time in which the Catholic community remembers those who have died. Did you know? At only 24 days old, your heart began beating. By eight weeks, all your organs were present and your unique fingerprints were forming. Ultrasounds show that by 18 weeks you could swim, somersault, suck your thumb, and even cover your ears if you heard loud music. If you'd been born just 23 weeks after conception, your chances would be 50 to 80%; by 25 weeks, it would be over 90%, and that's still months before fullterm birth.

Saint of the Month Albert the Great

Albert of Lauingen was born around 1200 into a noble family in what is modern-day Germany. He received an excellent education. After completing his elementary studies, he was sent to the University of Padua to study the liberal arts and was also introduced to the philosophy of Aristotle. Around 1223, Albert joined the Dominican order, following an apparition from the Blessed Virgin Mary. He continued his studies in important schools in Padua, Paris, and Cologne.

After completing his studies, he was ordained to the priesthood and was assigned to various teaching posts throughout Europe, most notably in Cologne. Father Albert had a voracious appetite for sacred knowledge. A significant part of his thought centered on Aristotle's philosophical principles.

Contrary to some modern thought, he maintained that science and theology were in perfect harmony. Thomas Aquinas became one of Father Albert's students; together they promoted incorporation of Aristotle's philosophical principles in logic and metaphysics with theology. Together, these men were among the greatest theologians to show that faith and reason are not exclusive of each other; rather, they are intimately interwoven and inseparable.

In 1254, Father Albert was made the provincial superior of the Dominican Order. He also served as the Bishop of Regensburg and other Papal diplomatic missions. In his later years, Albert became renowned as a mediator..

Albert is considered one of the greatest philosophical and theological minds and writers of the middle ages. During his life, Albert wrote thirty eight volumes covering topics ranging from philosophy to geography, astronomy, law, friendship and love.

He was known as "Albert the Great", while he was alive. Before his death, he mourned the early passing of his great student, Thomas Aquinas. Albert became ill in 1278 and he died on November 15, 1280. He was beatified in 1622 by Pope Gregory XV and canonized in 1931 by Pope Pius XI. He was declared Doctor of the Church during his canonization. His feast is celebrated on November 15
