Saint of the Month Paul VI, Pope

Giovanni Battista Montini was born in northern Italy in 1897 into a noble-class family. He was educated by Jesuits, and was a bright student. As a youth, he suffered from several chronic health issues. At age of 18, he entered the seminary and was ordained four years later.

Shortly after his priestly ordination, Father Montini was sent to Rome to study canon law and obtained his doctorate in canon law. He studied for the Vatican diplomatic corps and began his service as a diplomat in the papal household under Pope Pius XI. When Pope Pius XII was elected in 1939, Monsignor Montini worked with him daily, eventually acting as the pope's de facto personal secretary. In 1939, World War II broke out and Monsignor Montini assisted the pope in dealing with efforts to care for refugees. After World War II, he served in several prominent Vatican roles.

When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, Pope John XXIII was elected as his successor. The pope named Archbishop Montini as cardinal and appointed him to various Vatican posts. On October 11, 1962, Pope John XXIII formally opened the Second Vatican Council, but less than a year later he died. The pope's vision for the council was to bring the ancient faith of the Church into closer connection to the modern world.

After the death of Pope John XXIII, Cardinal Montini was elected pope on June 21, 1963. As pope, Paul VI presided over the remaining sessions of the Second Vatican Council. During the remainder of his papacy, he promoted world peace, social justice, ecumenism, and world unity.

Pope Saint Paul VI faced challenges from modernization. He sought to keep the ancient faith of the Church ever ancient while also

making it ever new and relevant to a world in need. He sought unity among Christians, peace among nations, and respect for the dignity of all.

Pope Paul VI died on August 6, 1978. He was beatified on October 19, 2014 and canonized on October 14, 2018 by Pope
