
Saint of the Month

Barnabas, originally named Joseph, was born into a Jewish Levite family in Cyprus early in first century of the Christian era. He is believed to be a cousin of Mark, the Evangelist. As a Levite, he would have spent time in Jerusalem during the time of Jesus' life on earth. Some sources say that he was a devoted disciple of Jesus during his earthly ministry and one of the seventy disciples that Jesus appointed (and he may have even been a follower of John the Baptist); others maintain that he was converted to Christianity shortly after Pentecost. After his conversion, he sold his property and donated the proceeds to the Christian Church in Jerusalem.

During the early years of the Church, Joseph earned a reputation as a successful preacher; the apostles subsequently gave him the name Barnabas, meaning "son of exhortation" or "consolation". During this time, Barnabas acquired a high position in the church and was considered an apostle.

One of the major events in Saint Barnabas' life was his introduction to the apostle Paul, whom he helped to become a prominent Christian leader. Despite the disciples' skepticism about Paul because of his earlier persecutions of Christians, Barnabas advocated for him and encouraged others to forgive him. He later travelled with Paul on numerous missionary journeys, and was instrumental in establishing the early Christian churches in Antioch, Cyprus and other parts of the Mediterranean.

Saint Barnabas was martyred in 61 AD, during a time of intense persecution of Christians by the Roman authorities. Barnabas was canonized as a saint by the early Christian church. His feast day is celebrated on June 11th.
