## Saint of the Month John Chrysostom

John was born in Antioch, Syria in 347, the son of a high-ranking military officer. His father died when he was very young, and he was raised as a Christian by his widowed mother. Although he studied law, he gave up his profession to study theology, ultimately becoming an ascetic hermit-monk in about 375. His lifestyle of self deprivation took its toll on his health, and he returned to Antioch. He became an ordained deacon in 381 and a priest in 386.

Over the next 12 years he established himself as a great preacher. John's preaching abilities earned him the surname


"Chrysostom" (meaning "golden-mouthed), and he is considered one of the greatest preachers in the history of Christianity. Over 800 of his homilies have been preserved. The most valuable of his works are his homilies on various books of the Bible. He emphasized charitable giving and was concerned with the spiritual and temporal needs of the poor. He spoke against abuse of wealth and personal property. The themes of his talks were practical, explaining the Bible's application to everyday life.

In 398 John was installed as Archbishop of Constantinople. He gained a large following among the people, but his teachings on the misuse of riches angered the wealthy and influential. His reforms of the clergy were also unpopular. But during his time as Archbishop, he also founded a number of hospitals in Constantinople.

In 403, John was condemned on a number of frivolous charges and banished from the city. John appealed his banishment but still

managed to communicate with his flock in Constantinople. He died in exile on September 14, 407.

John was canonized pre-congregation and declared Doctor of the Church in 1568 by Pope Pius V.
