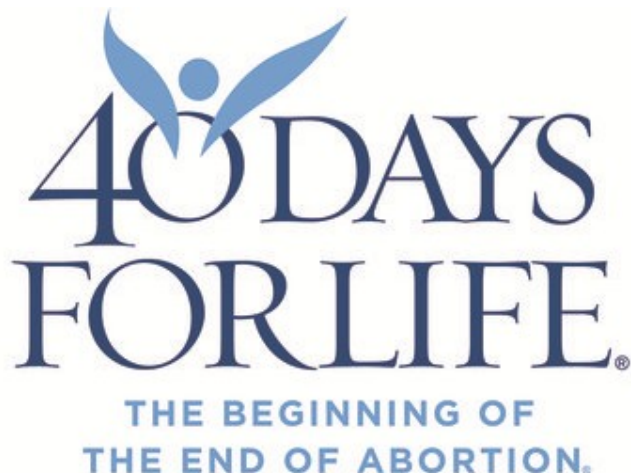

# Saint of the Month

## Gregory of Narek

Gregory was born about 950 to a Christian family dedicated to the Church. His father served as a bishop and theologian of the Armenian Church. After his wife's death, the bishop entrusted the boy to the care of an uncle, Anania. A respected scholar and monk, Anania founded the Narek Monastery (known as Narekavank) on the shores of Lake Van in what is today eastern Turkey and reared Gregory as one of the monastic community. Being raised in an intellectual and religious fervor, Grigor was ordained priest in 977 and taught others theology at the monastery school until his death. Few details of Gregory's life are known, but he is best known for his extensive writings. Scholars consider Gregory the most beloved and significant theological and literary figure of the Armenian religious tradition. As an Armenian monk, Gregory lived humbly and taught at the monastic school. He was a leader of the well-developed school of Armenian mysticism at the Monastery.

Gregory was a prolific writer and was venerated as a saint by the Armenian Church. His most famous work is *The Book of Lamentations*, or, as it is commonly known today, *The Book of Narek*. The loss of his mother early in life led Gregory to a deep devotion to our Blessed Mother. He would later write, "This spiritual, heavenly mother of light cared for me as a son more than an earthly, breathing, physical mother could".

It is important to understand the history of the Armenian Church. It is believed that early church apostles evangelized in Armenia in the first century. In 301, Christianity was established as the kingdom's official religion. In 451, the Armenian Church separated from the Church of Rome over disagreements on doctrine. In the 11<sup>th</sup> Century, the Kingdom of

Armenia was invaded by the Byzantines, then by the Turks and suffered greatly under foreign domination, culminating in the twentieth century with the Armenian genocide when the Turks murdered an estimated 1–1.8 million Armenians.

Throughout the centuries of great suffering and oppression, Saint Gregory's book of prayers became the daily prayers of the Armenian people. Everyone had a printed copy; many people even slept with a copy under their pillow. In 2015, when Pope Francis declared Saint Gregory a Doctor of the Church, and in 2021 when Saint Gregory was placed on the liturgical calendar for the Roman Church, his book of prayers suddenly became prayers for the entire world.
